MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD VIRTUALLY (VIA GOOGLE HANGOUTS) ON MONDAY 6th April 2020 AT 7.30 p.m.

8960 Special Arrangements

Owing to the current pandemic and lockdown situation, the usual face to face meeting of the Parish Council was unable to be held. Alternative arrangements had been made for a "virtual" meeting of the Parish Council to be held. "Google Hangouts" was selected as the chosen platform as all Councillors e-mail accounts run through Google.

The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming all Members and ensuring that everyone was visibly and audibly clear. The only technical issue was with Councillor Mansfield who was able to hear the discussion being held but, due to microphone problems, was unable to respond. The Chairman proceeded to conduct the meeting in the usual manner.

8961 Apologies for Absence

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Holdstock, Larkin and Turvey.

8962 Prejudicial Interest

There were no prejudicial interests to declare.

8963 Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting held on the 9th March 2020 were approved as a correct record and would be signed by the Chairman at the first available opportunity.

8964 Matters Arising

The following matter was noted:

 everything relating to waste, apart from essential waste collections, are currently on hold. This includes the closure of the local amenity sites. Fly tipping is being monitored as a result. Deep cleaning teams are on standby to react to the situation.

Public Forum

8965 There was no public forum.

8966 Covid 19 Update

The Chairman updated Members regarding the current extensive work being undertaken throughout the Borough to support residents. Wokingham Borough Council (WBC) has confirmed that throughout the crisis they are intending to support all residents regardless of age or circumstances.

Challenges are being encountered at notably Dinton Pastures Country Park where social distancing and group gatherings have been noted. The Police had been called the preceding weekend to address such problems and the decision made to close the Sandford Lane entrance to the park. Off road parking has been prevalent along Sandford Lane and Lea Heath Way. The Wheelwrights Arms Public House has blocked off their car park.

Councillor Lyon enquired as to what the response to the call for volunteers had been. The Chairman confirmed that a fantastic response had been received from residents of the Parish with over 60 individuals offering to provide services for shopping, prescription collection and general friendly chats. The Clerk had undertaken considerable work the preceding weekend, along with the Chairman and members of the Village Society to collate detailed information for a flier. The flier would be delivered to all households in Hurst indicating volunteers per area/street who are able to help along with contact details.

8967 Neighbourhood Planning

The Chairman confirmed that due to the current pandemic neighbourhood planning was on hold. It is hoped that virtual meetings of the Working Group can be held in the near future but this is to be arranged.

8968 Church Hill Petition

The Chairman confirmed that he had a new proposal which he would circulate to Members and request comments.

8969 Planning Applications

Members considered the applications attached to these minutes. They had no adverse comments with regards to applications 200476, 200490. They had no comment regarding application 193184. They objected to applications 200353 and 200618.

The Chairman confirmed that both the applications relating to the new proposed Dinton Activity Centre and the redirection of the St Nicholas CE Primary School footpath would be going to the May 2020 meeting of the Borough's Planning Committee.
